## Our Projects in Syria

Distribution of food baskets to approximately 1500 displaced families in informal camps in the countryside of Azaz city, Suran city, and the camps of Kafra village.



Providing daily bread to approximately 3000 displaced families in informal camps in the countryside of Azaz city, Suran city, Kafra village, and Aleppo city.



Providing clean drinking water to approximately 7,000 people in informal camps in the countryside of Azaz city, Suran city, and Kafra village.



Providing monthly financial sponsorships for 500 orphans living in informal camps in the countryside of Azaz city, Suran city, and Kafra village to ensure a dignified life for them.



Distributing school supplies to 500 displaced children in informal camps in the countryside of Azaz city, Suran city, and Kafra village to support their education.



Distributing food baskets during the holy month of Ramadan to 500 displaced families in informal camps in the countryside of Suran city, Azaz city, and Kafra village.



Distributing sacrificial meat during Eid al-Adha to 200 needy families in informal camps in the countryside of Azaz city, Suran city, and Kafra village.



Providing new clothes for 200 orphans to bring joy to their hearts and enhance their sense of warmth and belonging.



Organizing recreational activities for 750 orphaned children, including fun competitions and the distribution of prizes and gifts, to bring joy and happiness to their hearts.



## Our Projects in Gaza

Providing bread to approximately 1,500 besieged families in Gaza Strip, sheltering in temporary centers in Khan Yunis, Al-Daraj area, and Al-Malaab camp.



Providing ready-to-eat meals to approximately 2,000 needy families in northern and southern Gaza Strip.



Providing safe drinking water to families in northern Gaza, successfully ensuring clean water access for approximately 9,000 people.



Distributing new clothes to approximately 50 orphans in northern Gaza to support them emotionally and socially.



Providing financial sponsorships to approximately 20 orphaned children in northern Gaza to meet their basic needs and support them in the difficult circumstances they are facing.

Providing nutritious meals to children at the educational center in the village of Kousseri, helping to improve their health and enhance their educational opportunities.
